UPLOADING A TREE TO FAMILYSEARCH

FamilySearch Family Tree

A unified database that aims to contain one entry for each person recorded in genealogical records. All FamilySearch users can add ancestors, link them to existing records for that ancestor, and merge duplicate records.

Sources, images, and audio files can also be attached to people in the tree for free.

Why Merge Your Tree?

Invites collaboration in your genealogy work and allows a free channel for storing your genealogical data.

Step by Step Instructions

Upload Your Tree

click on the link **here** to upload your GEDCOM to FamilySearch Genealogies and selectively add your data to the shared Family Tree.

- Genealogies is a database collection of uploaded family trees
- Users can upload their tree into this collection which will then become public and searchable aside from living people who will be kept private.
- Once you upload, there is a tool that will help you to copy info from Genealogies into FamilySearch Family Tree.

Or

- Upload using a FamilySearch Compatible solution
 - 1. Go to the FamilySearch Solutions Gallery
 - 2. Find the category called **Family Tree Management**
 - 3. Find the application that you use and scroll to the section on FamilySearch compatibility to learn if there is a way to integrate the trees directly.
