

#### **Search Considerations**

- What records are included (or excluded).
- Which fields are indexed.
- Collection size and update date. (Displayed in Browse all published collections mode.)
- How the search engine interprets your search criteria.
- Other websites where the same/similar collections are found.

### **Search Strategies**

- Search a specific collection (1870 census) to answer a specific question (e.g., "Where was Adam Loewinger living in 1870?) or if you are having difficulty finding someone in a particular record.
- Search broadly using the main search landing page to begin documenting someone's life or to expand your search.



#### Search all collections from main page.

- Search here occasionally ("fishing").
- Enter key words in Collection Title box to see what collections exist.
  - E.g., "Virginia Mar" yields one Virginia and two West Virginia marriage collections.
  - Do not press [Enter] unless you type the exact collection title.
- Browse published collections to identify options/limitations for intentional searching ("hunting").


#### Read collection descriptions, wiki.

- Basic information about what is included, percent completed.
- Learn more \* link leads to wiki.


#### Review coverage tables/maps.

- Counties and dates covered in this collection. (Other years may be available in other collections, may never have been filmed/digitized, or may not exist.)
- Some collections combine multiple record types. Coverage tables give details.
