Level 1—Getting Started

(MAIN FLOOR)



1. Scanning Area

Use free photo and book scanning equipment to make digital copies of pictures and documents.

2. Kids Center


Watch your children in the play area as they color or play with toys. (Do not leave children unattended.)

3. Photo Op

Take a commemorative photograph of yourself in a vintage picture.

Level 2—United States and Canada Films

(UPSTAIRS)



1. Microfilm

The tall metal cabinets contain microfilm. Use the FamilySearch Catalog to located the correct microfilm. Please ask Library Staff for assistance.

2. Guest Computers


The library has 550 computers available for guest use, including access to genealogical subscription websites for free.

3. Microfilm Copy Center

Copy images from microfilm by printing them or saving them to a flash drive.

Level 3—United States and Canada Books

(UPSTAIRS)



1. US and Canada Map Collection

Check out our excellent US and Canada collection of historical maps. Note the state names listed on the front of the cabinets.

2. US and Canada Book Collection

With over 600,000 books and serials in the Library, ask one of our staff to learn how to determine the call number, row, and section number for your state and county.

Level B1—International Floor

(BASEMENT)



1. International Book Collection

Browse books from countries in Europe, Scandinavia, Asia, and Spanish-speaking countries.

2. International Displays

View items from different countries in the various display cases.

Level B2—British Floor

(BASEMENT)



1. British Books Collection

Browse our book collections from the British Isles, Ireland, New Zealand, and Australia.

2. British Map Collection

Visit this area to view large maps for the British Isles.

3. Family Tree Escalation

This support team can help resolve advanced Family Tree issues. Ask about their hours and availability.

4. British Displays

View items from the British Isles, Ireland, or Australia in the various display cases.
