Breadcrumb code: {{breadcrumb

| link4= Any jurisdiction lower than country (in order)
| link5= The lowest jurisdiction of the page
}}

#### Sidebar:

Every country page has a "country sidebar" that is found on the right-hand side of the page. It contains integral information pertinent to genealogy in that particular country.

#### Infoboxes:

On some locality pages, there may be an infobox on the right-hand side of the page. Infoboxes are used to display additional jurisdiction information for that individual locality.

- Headings:
  - Used to organize content
  - Keep similar information together
  - o Help users quickly scan an article to find information
  - Headings should be kept short

- Online Resources Include:
  - Online records
  - Online publications
  - o Other relevant online references, summaries, or tools
- Histories:
  - o Country level has a "History" article in the country sidebar
  - Sub-jurisdiction/locality level has "History" heading on the jurisdiction/locality page
