— REMONSTRANT CHURCH OR BROTHERHOOD — (REMONSTRANTSCHE KERK OF BROEDERSCHAP)

Shortly after 1572, when the Calvinistic Dutch Reformed church had gained predominance in the Netherlands, doctrinal differences appeared among the theologians within the church. After 1600 this dogmatic quarrel became very violent. Franciscus Gomarus, a professor at the University of Leiden, defended the Calvinistic doctrines; Jacobus Arminius of the same university took a rather liberal view. Arminius died in 1609. The following year his adherents, under the leadership of Wtenbogaert, wrote the "Five Articles of Remonstrance" and presented this petition to the state government, of whom they requested mediation. One year later, the orthodox majorty of the Dutch Reformed church countered with a petition, "The Contra Remonstrance," which the government took under advisement. In 1614, Hugo de Groot wrote of the "Resolution Towards Peace Between Churches," and later became involved in mediations between the factions, but the quarrel grew more intense.

The National Synod of the Dutch Reformed church held at Dordtrecht in 1618 and 1619 discussed the matter of the Remonstrants, and after they were heard they were dismissed and their teachings condemned. The two hundred ministers who embraced the views of Arminius were deposed and ordered to sign the "Declaration or Act of Standstill or Cessation." Those who did not comply were arrested and fined or banished. Government leaders, among them Johan van Oldenbarnevelt and Hugo de Groot, were jailed; the first was beheaded and the second sentenced to life imprisonment, but later escaped. Ordinances of 1619 and 1620 were directed at further uprooting this faction.

The Remonstrant church or brotherhood was founded on 30 Sept. 1619 in Antwerp, Belgium (then the Spanish Southern Netherlands) by a group of former ministers of the Dutch Reformed church who were in exile. After their church was founded, some of the exiled ministers returned to the Netherlands and succeeded in organizing a number of congregations. In some areas they assembled to worship under the pretense of being Mennonites and in time they became tolerated. In 1630 they were allowed to build their first church building in Amsterdam and were soon permitted to do so in other towns.

During the 17th century they were able to organize nearly fifty congregations throughout the Netherlands, and one parish was also founded in 1621 in Fredrichstadt, Sleswig-Holstein, then part of Denmark. Seventy-five Dutch Remonstrant families settled there.

The registers of thirty congregations have been preserved, most of them date from the 1650-1700 time period and consist mainly of baptismal and membership listings. Marriage registers generated by the Remonstrant church are few, but most of their marriages are recorded in the civil marriage records. In areas where Remonstrant church records are missing or incomplete, records of the civil authorities and notaries should be searched.

The tables appearing on the following pages show the extent of Remonstrant church records which have been preserved. Column 1 lists the place name, column 2 the province, and column 3 indicates the type of record extant. Column 4 gives the film number of the record as found in the holdings of the Genealogical Society, and column 5 contains the initials of the camera operator and film number as found in the film collections in the Netherlands to assist persons there to locate the proper film.
