What is the FamilySearch Wiki?

It is a place for indexing support to help you with indexing.

The Family Search Wiki is a place where we publish information about Family Search indexing, including:

- Project Instructions
- Project Updates
- General Guidelines
- How to Presentations to help with indexing/arbitration
- Statistical information about projects
- Additional indexing helps for many projects

The Family Search Wiki is where you have a place to tell us about project specific issues.

- Problems that were unforeseen when a project was released
- Unexpected documents
- Items that are not covered in any indexing support information

There is no need to ask general indexing questions in the wiki. Please contact support about those issues.

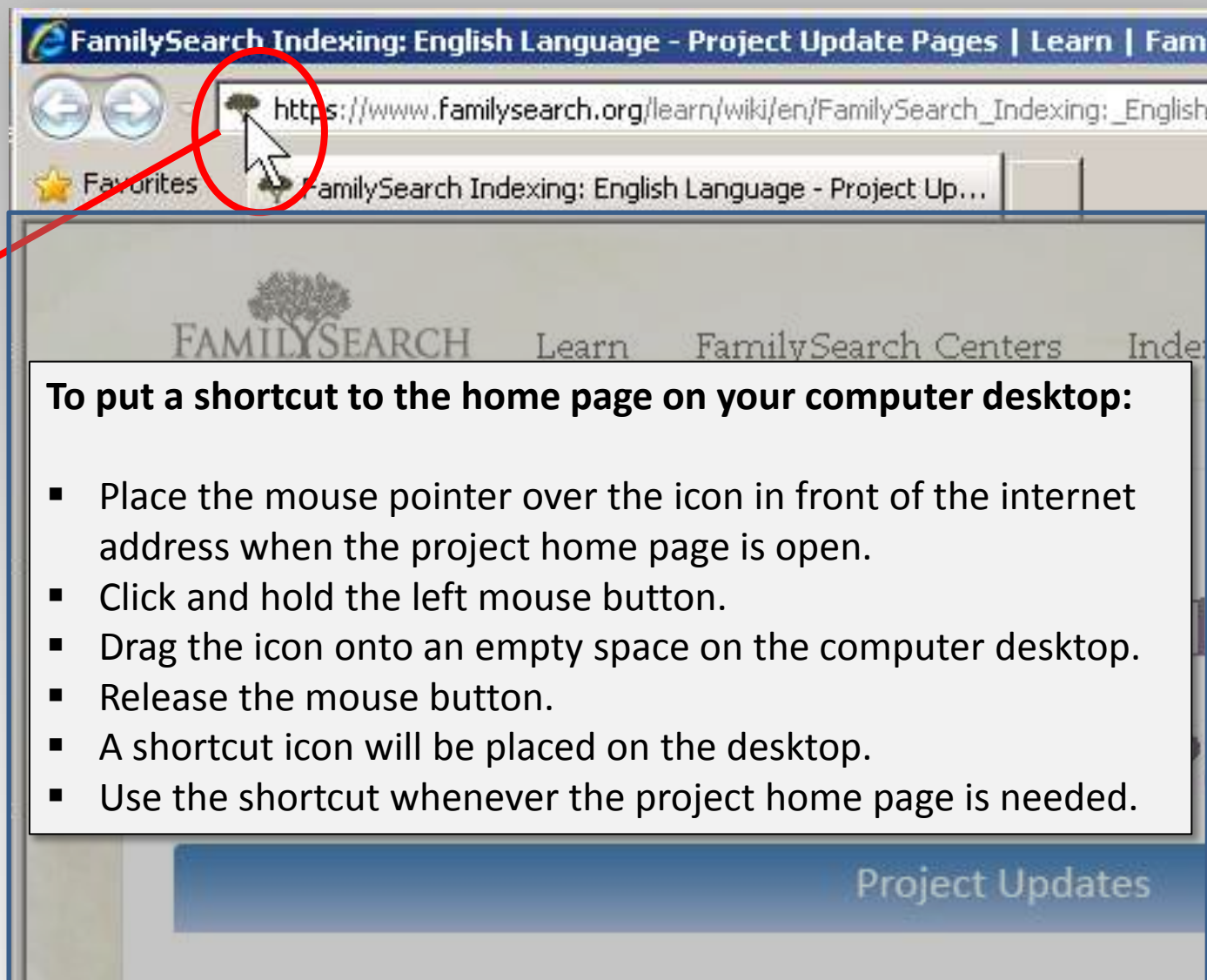

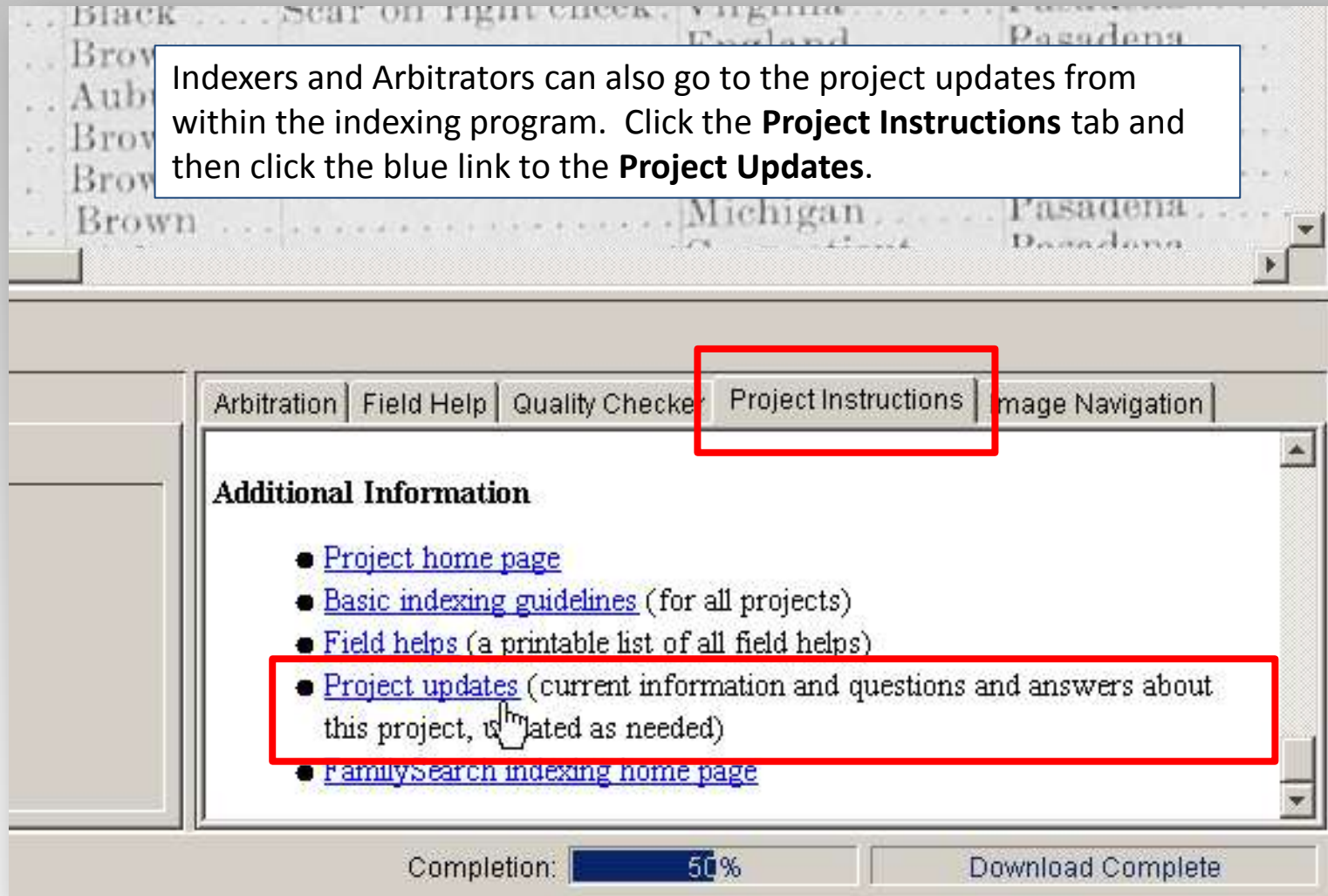

All project pages have the same features so let's use the California Voting Registers as an example of how to use all the project features.

Indexers and Arbitrators can also go to the project updates from within the indexing program. Click the **Project Instructions** tab and then click the blue link to the **Project Updates**.

What should I put on this page?

Answer:

- Questions relating to this project.
- Observations that are general in nature and would be relevant for other indexers and arbitrators working with similar batches.
- Often repeated mistakes arbitrators and indexers are making.

Question:

What things do not work well for the wiki?

Answer:

- There will always be a delay in responding, so issues that require a timely answer, such as being unable to read a name or submit a batch would not be answered soon enough to help.
- Wiki personnel are unable to address computer or technical program questions.

Notice: If a submission is a duplicate of an earlier one, it may be removed.

Question:

Why are there two pages, **Project Updates** and **Additional Helps**, for answers on the wiki?

Answer:

- **Project Updates** are clarified instructions from the project managers.
- **Additional Helps** are answers to submissions by wiki personnel concerning how to index and arbitrate the project based on the current guidelines.
