



Introducing Danish Probates

Class Objective:

This class is an introductory class introducing you to the Danish Probates:

1. A short overview and background
2. what information can be found in the probates
3. where can probates be accessed

Introduction:

Probates are records involving the legal transfer of property upon the death of its owner, and exist in practically every country. The records often give information on family relationships and are invaluable in helping a person trace Danish ancestors. Fortunately many of the probate records are preserved, and many pre-date church registers.

Types of Probate Records:

- “Skifteprotokollerne”: Administrations of estates
- “Overformynderi protokollerne”: Guardianship supervisions
- “Testamenter”: wills

Probate Jurisdictions:

- Copenhagen City (København)
- Other Cities (Købstaderne)—Ålborg, Horsens, Fredricia etc
- Rural areas (“paa landet”)—local parishes

Cities other than Copenhagen:

Probate jurisdiction of the cities was under the direction of city officials until 1919 when it was made the responsibility of the “Underrets dommer”/local judges. (Exception: Copenhagen).

Pre 1816: clergy and persons working with the clergy, and the schools (including wives and children) had special probate court under the jurisdiction of the Herreds Provsti (district deans).

A few cities had special probate jurisdictions;

- Horsens - the Russian princely court, from 1781
- Helsingør - Øresund customs office, 1793-1815
- Fredericia - Jewish, 1736-1814

Rural areas:

- Godser-for private land estates or manors (each parish can have numerous manors/estates within its boundaries; each responsible for keeping probate records for the persons living on their property). In order to find your ancestors probate you need to

know the name of the manor.

Example: A Danish Parish:

Numerous estates owned property in this parish. Each estate kept probate records for the farmers living on their land. Where would you look for the probate records? The Family History Library Catalog will show you which farms and villages can be found on what estate!

If you were looking for a probate in Skallerup in 1811, you may have to look through eight of the probate records (from the various gods) listed to be sure you have covered all your bases.

- Amt og Amtstue - for the counties
- Rytterdistrikter - for the cavalry districts

- Herrederne - for the districts

The Danish Law of Christian V of 1683 (the first law code for Denmark)

Notice should be made immediately after the death of a person to the local authority

A probate should be written if:

- Survived by minor heirs
- Heirs were absent from home
- Had no heirs

Estate was sealed for final inventory and administration

- 30 days after death, estate as to be registered by probating officials in the presence of heirs and guardians
- Inventory and appraisal of all property
- Total debt and assets
- Settlement and distribution of estate among heirs indicated
- Signed by heirs, guardians, and probating authority

No widower or widow could, by law, remarry before the deceased's estate had been settled with the legal heirs.

If none of the heirs were minors, and all heirs were present, the family could act under their own private jurisdiction; unless, of course the family wanted a legal proceeding.

Only about 25% of the population had a probate!

Guardians:

- Guardians were needed for widows (laugvæрге) and children (væрге) 25 years or younger.
- Usually a close relative: father, grandfather, uncle, or brother 25 years or older
- Court could appoint a suitable guardian

Probate content:

- Date of registration
- Name of the deceased
- Residence
- Possible date of death
- List of all legal heirs, their relationship and residence
- Ages of surviving heirs (especially the minor children)
- Names of husbands of married daughters, and their places of residence
- Names of wives and children's guardians (possibly relationships)
- Estate inventory listing assets and liabilities
- Names of probate officials
- Names of witnesses and/or appraisers
- Reference to any earlier documents relating to the inheritance of property

- Settlement of the estate-distributions to the heirs and creditors
- If any children are dead and left descendants, they will be listed

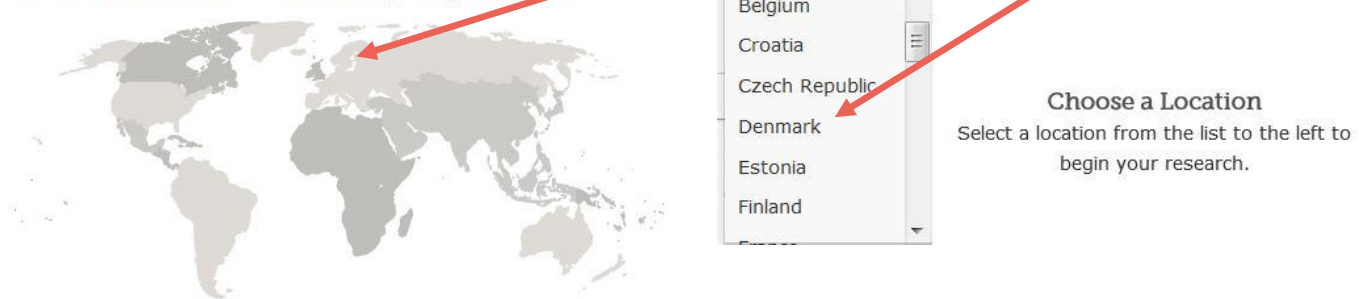

Description

Records created by estates across Denmark. Some estates cover multiple counties. In addition to record property, the estates also served as probate authorities and military conscription districts for persons at genealogical and biographical information on the families that owned the estates. The originals of these records are in the archives of Denmark.

Probates on Arkivalieronline:

In the browser of your choice type in **sa.dk**. This will take you to the opening page of “arkivalieronline”.

Under **Vælg arkivalietype** choose **Find din slægt**. Click **search (søg)**. Scroll down (the list is in alphabetical order) and find references to various probate material.

See below: Here you can find probate records covering **Sønderjylland**, **Copenhagen**, “**hele landet**” –the whole country, **military** etc. Choose the one that will cover your particular interest.

“Skifter, hele landet” (probates from the whole country) can be very helpful. While many parishes seem to have *only indexes*, many parishes have indexes to probates *as well as* the probates themselves. That is exciting!
