Places	 Source's place is the in the same place but less specific (i.e. county vs town) Source lists nearby bigger city instead of the smaller town Source lists a known residence location 	 Source lists a new place from known information Source lists correct city name but the transcription provides wrong country (i.e. the source lists Paris, which could be Paris, France or Paris, Idaho) 	 Source provides a 2nd location in same US census Source place doesn't match the current information of person Source place doesn't make sense with the current information of person
