Census

Years	Provinces
1825, 1831	Lower Canada (Quebec) and only head of household
1842	Canada East and Canada West, only head of household
1851 - 1861	Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island (added 1861), head of household New Brunswick, Ontario, Quebec, everyone named
1871- 1921	Every province included Manitoba enumerated in 1870
1906, 1916, 1926	Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and Alberta had additional censuses

Civil Registration

- Civil registration was a provincial responsibility and varies from place to place in content and availability.
- Alberta
 - o Begin in 1870, general compliance reached 1930
 - o Provincial Archives of Alberta: Birth, Marriage, and Death indexes

- British Columbia
 - o Begin in 1872, general compliance reached 1920

New Brunswick

- Births begin 1800, marriages and deaths 1847

Newfoundland and Labrador

- Begin in 1891
- The Rooms (provincial archives) have microfilms of their civil registrations

Nova Scotia

- o Begin in 1864

- Begin in 1869

Border Crossing Records

- Entering Canada
 - Not all crossings were recorded
 - o 1908-1918: lists by port and date
 - o 1919-1924: individual forms filed by the first letter of surnames
 - o 1925-1935: lists by port and date
 - Ancestry Canada, Border Crossings from U.S. to Canada, 1908-1935

Entering the United States

- Not all crossings were recorded
- 1895-1914: recorded at seaports and train stations along the border from Washington to Maine
- 1914-1954: recorded arriving at train stations along the border from New York to Vermont
- o Ancestry U.S., Border Crossings from Canada to U.S., 1895-1960
- FamilySearch <u>United States Border Crossings from Canada to United States</u>, 1895-1956

Naturalization Records

- British subjects did not naturalize until 1947
- Pre-1914 Naturalization
 - After 3 years of residency individuals would apply through the local courts
 - Search for court records in the FamilySearch catalog and local archives

Post-1914 Naturalization

- After 5 years adult men and unmarried women would apply to the national government
- Wives and children were naturalized under the husband/father
- When individuals were naturalized it was announced in the national newspaper the Canada Gazette and the annual Secretary of State reports
- Search for our ancestor in the Naturalization lists, 1915 to 1951 database on LAC
- Use the certificate number to order original record copies from <u>Immigration</u>, Refugees and Citizenship Canada
