Oklahoma – Indian Territory 1830's- 1907, the sooner state, a twin! Achieved statehood 16 November 1907 and became the 46<sup>th</sup> state. An overview of the census, vital, church, land and property and probate records. Brief review of American Indian research. Repositories

Original American Indian tribes of Oklahoma: Caddo, Pawnee, Wichita, Quapaw, Oto, and Osage. Forced migration brought the Five Civilized Tribes (Cherokee, Choctaw, Chickasaw, Creek, and Seminole) into Indian Territory, "Oklahoma" during the year's 1830's-1848. Over 65 other tribes from all over the country were relocated to Oklahoma.

- American Indians original and those who came through forced migration
- Trading post developed and grew into commercial settlements
- Southern settlers (needed permission from the Tribes)
- Railroads: Santa Fe, Pacific, and Union Pacific
- Cattle drives 1866-1886 Texas to Kansas
- General Allotment Act 1887 land from Tribe to individual Indian
- Land Runs: 1889, 1891, 1892, 1893, and 1895
- Land Auctions / Lotteries: 1901, 1906

**PROBATE RECORDS** Prior to statehood, the records were kept by the U.S. district courts. Now kept by jurisdiction of the probate or county courts.
